OCTOBER IS OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY MONTH An Interview with Corie Haslbeck, MHC Occupational Therapist

Corie Haslbeck has been an occupational therapist at Misericordia Health Centre for 24 years, starting here after graduation. She is currently working for the Ophthalmology and Easy Street programs. In the Easy Street program Corie assists clients with power mobility, this includes training and assessing them to use power wheelchairs and scooters. For the Ophthalmology program Corie assists clients with low vision or monocular vision with education, referrals and the occasional home visit.

Corie described occupational therapy as assisting people to do their activities of daily life. These activities are different for everyone so the goals for each client vary and it is up to the occupational therapist to assist their clients in attaining them.

Recently Corie assisted one of her clients who has very low vision and recently lost his ability to walk to get a power wheelchair, provided through the Society for Manitobans with Disabilities (SMD) Wheelchair Services. This client is now back at work using his wheelchair and he is looking forward to the next Winnipeg Transit training session through Easy Street to find out if he can use this city service with his new chair. Many people think that you cannot use a power wheelchair if you have

very low vision but with the proper training it is possible.

Corie has done many presentations about working with people with vision loss who need power wheelchairs; this September, grateful for the support of MHC, she presented this work in Denver, Colorado at the Envision Low Vision Rehabilitation Conference where she also learned about many low vision rehabilitation ideas and

programs.

Corie also spoke of a young Easy Street client who recently got her driver's license back after a brain injury. This client will now be going to SMD for employment counsiling and training.

October is Occupational Therapy Month and here at MHC we are very proud of all of the good work our OT team is able to accomplish!
