PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE: LIGHTHOUSE PROVIDES GUIDANCE



MHC recently celebrated Mission Day: a day to recognize our staff, physicians and volunteers who live our Mission in the spirit of *compassion of the heart for those in need*.

Mission Day is also a way to celebrate our legacy of our Founders, the Sisters of Misericordia. Today most of the congregation is retired from their active ministry but continue to be an inspiration to their heritage organizations.

These heritage organizations are collectively called the International Misericordia Family (IMF), with locations across North and South America. Representatives from

the IMF meet with the Misericordia Sisters annually.

This fall I was fortunate to attend the annual IMF gathering and had the opportunity to ask the Misericordia Sisters if they would consider creating a video to share with staff on our Mission Day. The Sisters are very humble and felt we could do a good job without their input. Through our conversation I was able to explain how their continued presence is important and inspiring to us.

Fortunately, the Misericordia Sisters did create a video introducing the International Misericordia Family's powerful new symbol: a lighthouse.

Why did the IMF choose the lighthouse as a symbol? Some ideas:

- No matter if the weather be calm or stormy, the lighthouse keeps watch
- Battered by waves, tides and storms, it is built to resist
- Exists to protect the well-being and security of others
- Forever vigilant, be it night or day
- Like a hand extended, it guides the way
- Flames revives the one who has lost hope
- Brings peace and serenity by its ongoing presence

I encourage you to watch the Misericordia Sisters' video and read the backgrounder describing the representation of parts of the lighthouse on M-NET; it is very interesting.




Mary Ann Masesar

The Doctor is in Dr. Gdih Gdih



MHC Ophthalmologist Dr. Gdih has been expanding his practice in Libya since the 2011 unrest which caused many of the hospitals in the country to work under the standards. He recently returned from his semi-annual trip to the country where, in two weeks, he performed roughly 200 cataract, glaucoma and pediatric glaucoma surgeries.

Inspired by the Manjari Sankurathri Memorial Foundation, where Dr. Gdih spent some time during his residency at the University of Ottawa and Ottawa Eye Institute, he knew he wanted to help as many people as possible when he finished his education. Dr. Gdih accomplishes this by traveling to Libya twice each year where he provides training, consultations and performs roughly 500 surgeries annually.

He thanks MHC for their continued donations to International Hope Canada Inc. Through Hope physicians like Dr. Gdih can access supplies and equipment that would otherwise not be available. Many of these items are now off-contract and have been replaced by the supplier with newer models; this older equipment is checked to make sure it is still in working order and sterilized prior to donation.

Following his graduation from the University of Ottawa in 2009, Dr. Gdih completed a one-year Glaucoma Fellowship at the University of Toronto. When he is not working at MHC or in Libya Dr. Gdih is working alongside MHC Ophthalmologists Dr. Stephen Brodovsky and Dr. John Van der Zweep at Aqua i Laser in downtown Winnipeg.

When asked why he chose to live in Winnipeg he commented on the wish-list he had made while looking for work as a glaucoma specialist and that Winnipeg



checked the most boxes. Looking back, even on one of the days last month that was colder than -45 with the windchill, he said he would pick Winnipeg again, that a place has "more important things than just weather." In Winnipeg, one of these more important things is its multiculturalism. Though indoor soccer leagues in the winter to help fill the time between his summer outdoor games may help a little bit.

MHC would like to thank Dr. Gdih for being a part of our MHC Family, both as an accomplished physician and as a willing participant of endeavors like the January 2018 Nice Tweets videos. We would also like to thank Aqua i Laser for their Gold Sponsorship of the MHC Foundation 2018 Gala.

THE MISERICORDIA HERITAGE COLLECTION

The Misericordia Heritage Collection is currently held on the third floor of the MERC Building. It includes hundreds of documents, photos, memorabilia, and objects dated from 1898 to the present. Many people think the focus of the Collection is only the School of Nursing. However, for the past three years, it has included the history of the hospital and the Misericordia Sisters.

Here are just a few of the treasures that the Collection holds:

- A signed petition in 1898 from neighbours indicating that the
 work Misericordia Sisters did (caring for single mothers and their
 babies) was unsuitable for their neighbourhood. They demanded
 the Sisters' workplace be moved. The neighbours raised \$1000 to
 move the Sisters' workplace to a new site in 1899 (the current site of
 Misericordia Health Centre)
- Photographs of both the outside and interior of Misericordia General Hospital (now the Misericordia Health Centre) since 1899 showing the various additions, demolitions and changes over time
- Photographs, textbooks and medical equipment from 1901 that show how health care has changed over the years.
- Military medals worn by men and women who worked in or graduated from Misericordia and who served in World War I, II or the Boer War
- Clothing worn by volunteers, patients, and health care personnel since 1924
- Letters and cards written or received by nurses and doctors since 1930
- Photographs and other documents (e.g., musical scores) detailing the many concerts, dances, parties, sports events, and celebratory events that were held at Misericordia since 1898
