PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE: INTRODUCING MISERICORDIA TERRACE



To me, spring signifies new starts and new beginnings.

On that note, I'm pleased to introduce a new name that will be joining the MHC lexicon: Misericordia Terrace.

MHC's campus of long-term care includes some names you're already familiar with: Misericordia Place, PRIME and transitional care. Misericordia Terrace is the name we've chosen for the MHC assisted living centre that is currently under construction at 691 Wolseley Avenue.

This much-needed affordable housing facility has been many years in the making, but the naming signifies a major milestone in MHC's future. Aligning with our Mission, Misericordia Terrace is an important next step

in meeting the evolving health-care needs of the community.

Misericordia Terrace will bridge an existing gap between facilities that provide 24/7 medical support (hospitals and personal-care homes) and those that do not (apartments/houses), creating affordable, safe housing for older adults that supports independent, healthy and active living. Moreover, the assisted living centre is not-for-profit and the 97 suites will be rented out below market rates.

While the physical structure is not yet completed – but thankfully, the pile-driving is done! – we are one step closer to seeing this project come to fruition. And now with a new name, comes some exciting next steps! We are currently planning a marketing strategy to promote Misericordia Terrace in advance of completing construction. We have already had interest and enquiries from members of the public!

I believe it's important that you, the MHC family, are kept in-the-loop about projects and new developments that are taking place at Misericordia. Please see page 2 for a few FAQs about the assisted living centre, Misericordia Terrace.


Spring has certainly sprung in Winnipeg! With a fresh new season, we've launched an exciting and impactful new fundraising campaign: Around the World in 80 Days.



A: The basement tunnel will remain as a service tunnel only and a second-floor skywalk between Misericordia Terrace and our Wolseley East building will provide public access.

Q: Will PRIME or TCU clients have priority access to rent a suite?

A: No, MHC PRIME/TCU clients will apply to rent a suite like any other member of the community.




SOCIAL WORK MONTH: MEET DAVID

"I usually go into the day with an idea of what's going to happen, but there's always the likelihood that something comes up that takes precedent over everything else," says David Rowe, social worker for Transitional Care Unit (TCU), Cornish 6.

David joined the MHC social work team in August 2019 and works alongside Crystal Cuthbertson-Black (Cornish 2) and Angela Harrysingh (Cornish 5), to cover all clients on the three TCUs.

"For TCU clients, there's no clear-cut disposition, and some individuals have quite complex needs, so we require more time for assessment," says David.
