I am pleased to report that the COVID-19 outbreak on MP3 has been declared over. We will, as always, continue to closely monitoring our residents and responding to any concerns or symptoms that arise.

Get to Know Me posters and Memory boxes – knowing our residents better

The MP team, including social work, recreation and spiritual health, support initiatives to help us get to know our residents and support them better. Research tells us that knowledge of a person's past and present helps form better connections with caregivers and advances kindness, humanity and respect.

One initiative is creating a **Get to Know me poster** for each resident's room which includes information related to things like primary language, hearing, comprehension, life interests, likes/dislikes and important people in their lives. We will be asking for this kind of information for your loved one's poster. As well, if you have information you wish to share, speak to our staff from social work, recreation or spiritual care.

Another great initiative is a **Memory Box**—small, enclosed and locked boxes in residents' rooms. These are meant to be filled with items that are meaningful to the residents, including photos (e.g., photos of family, pets, past events and places travelled) and other small items. **Please bring in such items for your loved one's memory box!** When you bring in items you can ask
