It is with a heavy heart I share with you a third COVID-19 positive MP resident passed away Wednesday. We send strength and comfort and share in the sadness of families and friends.

We are pleased to see many MP1 residents with active cases doing well for a number of consecutive days and are hopeful we can share that they are recovered shortly.

We continue to work vigilantly to manage and contain this dreadful virus. We now have five active cases on MP3 and are testing all MP3 residents. We are also working to cohort (move to one area) cases upon the recommendation of Infection, Prevention and Control experts.
