MP Staff Profile: Karlie Wilkie, Occupational Therapist, Rehabilitation Services


On behalf of the Misericordia Place team, I'd like to give a warm welcome to Karlie Wilkie. She is a great addition to the long-term care team and we are impressed by her enthusiasm and creative problem-solving skills.

Karlie joined the MHC family in summer 2019. She has worked in various programs at Misericordia, including PRIME, Transitional Care, and Misericordia Place. Initially hired as a casual occupational therapist, Karlie is now a permanent employee of MHC. She confirms that Misericordia truly is one of the best places to work in the city due to the friendly "community feel" and the many meaningful collegial friendships developed within the facility.

Karlie's motivation to help others is not limited to patients. Earlier this fall, she rescued an injured pigeon outside MHC.

"I was in the office and I heard a noise outside the window. There was a pigeon flapping its wings and pecking on the glass trying to get in!" says Karlie, noting that her colleagues jumped in to help her with the rescue effort.

She brought the pigeon home and ensured it safely made it to Prairie Wildlife Rehabilitation Centre where it was determined to be dehydrated and extremely underweight. Volunteers nursed Karlie's rescue pigeon back to health and reintegrated it with other fosters to the community.
